2017	2.5 gal bag	Haylage/Baleage	Baleage: no moisture limitations, or forage species
2017	2.5 gal bag	Orchardgrass Hay	Gather composite from multiple bales
2017	2.5 gal bag	Mixed Grass Hay	Gather composite from multiple bales
2017	2.5 gal bag	Alfalfa	Composite sample from multiple bales
